more about them.




















Let's Celebrate Attendance Hints and Tips No. 2: Teaching Good Habits

It is important for parents to make attending school a priority.

Allowing children days off for birthdays, to look after younger children, to go shopping, to keep you company or because they were tired from a late night, not only sends the wrong message to your child, it is also against the law.

Children who get used to having days off school for these kinds of reasons develop an attitude that their attendance at school is not very important. This can become a big issue as a child gets older.

Teach your children that being on time is important. Children that are often late to school miss the part of the school day when the teacher explains new activities. The beginning of the day is also when many students are freshest and can concentrate better.

Students that are late on a regular basis may become the target for comment by other students and often, as a result, isolate themselves from their peers.

Principal's Report

Very soon, our students in Year 1 will perform the Year 1 Phonics Screening Check. This is a mandatory check by the department of all Year 1 students in their progression of their phonics knowledge. The Year 1 Phonics Screening Check is a short, quick assessment. Each student will sit with a known teacher and will be asked to read 40 words aloud. These words include 20 real words and 20 nonsense words. The test normally takes a few minutes. If a student is having difficulty, the teacher will stop the check. The check is carefully designed not to be stressful. The assessment includes pseudo or nonsense words to see if the student can use their knowledge of blending to read a word rather than their memory of having seen that word before. If you have any further questions, please talk to your child's class teacher.

Congratulations to Spencer Tourle on a well-deserved 6th place in the 11 Years PSSA Cross Country Championship last week. Spencer set himself a goal and has worked tirelessly to achieve it. Quirindi Public School is so very proud of Spencer's result knowing very well the determination he has to succeed and pursue his goals. Watch out Nationals, Spencer is on his way!


